



Polish students with the opportunity for a unique transatlantic internship!

On January 11, Transatlantic Future Leaders Forum (TFLF) begins recruitment for the third edition of their Congressional internship program in London and Washington D.C. seeking the best and brightest university students. Application deadline is March 15, 2018.

This highly competitive program runs in the Summer of 2018 and includes internships in U.S. Congressional offices and UK Parliament offices. Additionally, the organizers prepare a series of meetings with representatives from the government, business and NGO sectors. In 2017 interns visited, among others, the headquarters of the World Bank, the Boeing plant in Charleston and the U.S. Department of State and met with the Polish ambassador in the U.S.

Transatlantic Future Leaders Forum's goal is to develop a cadre of young Polish leaders who understand the importance of Poland's relationship with the United Kingdom, the United States, Europe and NATO. Since 2016, the U.S. Embassy in Warsaw has been a strategic partner of the program. The U.S. Embassy helps in the recruitment process, covers some administration costs and also helps organize meetings for TFLF interns with U.S. government representatives.

Selection Process:

To participate in the program candidates must have:

- Polish citizenship and currently enrolled in an institution of higher learning.
- Strong academic performance.
- Excellent written and spoken English.
- Be 26 years old or younger

Preference for candidates with involvement in student activities, volunteerism and/or NGO experience.

Written Application: Applications can be submitted from **January 11 to March 15, 2018** via the online form found on the TFLF website <http://transatlanticforum.org/>.

Oral Assessment: Selected persons will have the opportunity to present themselves during the oral exam in Warsaw at the beginning of April 2018.
